NINE CONVENIENT LOCATIONS TO DISPOSE OF UNUSED MEDICATIONS IN CENTRAL COUNTY!

There are now 9 drop-off sites in Central Contra Costa County where residents can dispose of unwanted and expired pharmaceuticals. Disposal of pharmaceuticals either down the toilet, sink drain, or in the trash has become a serious source of pollution in our waterways. The drop-off program can alleviate a significant portion of that pollution. Before arriving at the drop off site, pour unwanted pills into a quart-size sealable plastic bag and recycle the empty plastic containers. All liquid medications should be left in the original bottles but also put into a sealed plastic bag to prevent leakage. At the site, look for the clearly marked green collection box. It is that easy!
